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Treffers, in his thesis of 1978, distinguished horizontal and vertical mathematising Horizontal mathematising which makes a problem field accessible to mathematical treatment (mathematical in the narrow formal sense versus vertical mathematising, which effects the more less or sophisticated mathematical (Freudenthal. processing. 1991, p. 40)







Research methodology

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- Analysis of the potential of modelling created problem



Criteria for Modeling Problems	Explanation	The guiding questions for the criteria
Reality	Problem includes a real world situation and the problem situation overlaps with the reality of the individual	 Does the problem involve a real world situation? Does the problem situation include information and explanation that may be meaningful to the individual?
Openness	Problem is based on assumptions and predictions (interpretation) and open to different and original solutions	 Is the problem suitable for interpretation and assumption? Are there different solutions to the problem?
Complexity	Having implicit mathematics in the problem and the individual's desire or need to solve the problem	 Does the individual feel the need to use mathematical ways to solve the problem? Does the problem cause a feeling of complexity or helplessness for the individual?
Model Eliciting	Solving the problem according to mathematical modeling process	• Can the problem be solved by mathematizating the real world situation?

















